Person-Centered Meetings

Some of you have already taken part in one or more of our person-centred meetings in the form of a PATH (Planning Alternative Tomorrows with Hope) or PCP (Person-Centred) Outcomes meeting. Thank you.

In these meetings we meet with the child, family, and other key adults. Together we think about the child's strengths, their hopes and aspirations, and what will help them reach towards those aspirations into adulthood.



The format of these meetings has been developed by our educational psychology team and recently introduced in our area. Feedback from staff, families and children who have taken part has been overwhelmingly positive. We would love to hear your views.
