Neurodevelopmental Service

Collaboration with stakeholders

The members of the Neurodevelopmental Service continue to collaborate with a range of stakeholders. The team regularly meet with members of NELPCF to share information and gain feedback from NEL's parent carers. A member of the Neurodevelopmental Service now attends the SPACE Forum and is available to answer questions and offer information and advice to parent carers and setting staff. In addition to this they have attended the GP Forum, met with the School Nursing Team, attended the Paediatric Forum and attended individual GP Practices, attended the SENCo Network to walk them through the changes, the new referral form and or provide updates on the current situation. Completing the referral form

The team offered some online training sessions on **completing the new referral form** for stakeholders - parent carers were also welcome to attend sessions. The team walked stakeholders through the referral form and answered any questions that were raised. These sessions were attended by 167 stakeholders.

Your voice and feedback on the referral form

As the Neurodevelopmental Assessment Referral Form is newly developed the team are wanting to seek feedback from parent carers who has recently had their child referred and from practitioners who have recently completed the referral. The team are currently creating a survey to collate feedback from all stakeholders so please check out their website for further details and information. Your feedback is invaluable and will assist the team in considering if any changes or improvements are needed to the referral form.

Private assessments and diagnosis

At the last SPACE Forum we had someone who came ask shared her experience of living with ADHD. A question was asked about private assessments and whether these diagnoses are recognised in NEL:

The Neurodevelopmental Service aim to meet the identified needs of children and young people, irrespective of their diagnosis.

Private assessments will be considered on a case-by-case basis and will be reviewed to ensure the assessment processes and diagnostics have followed National Institute of Clinical Excellence (NICE) guidelines. NICE provides guidance to professionals and patients around what is expected from an evidence-based assessment and/or intervention. The guidance is readily available online. For example, the guidance for ADHD is NG87 and for for autism in Under 19s is CG128.

It is important to note that not all assessments carried out privately will meet the above criteria. Please check before proceeding with any private assessment that it will meet the necessary standards and click on the link below for more guidance:

Support while you wait

Navigo's Neurodevelopmental Team have been working hard to reduce waiting times across their pre-assessment and assessment pathways. We appreciate whilst waiting for an assessment it can be difficult to source help with managing a child's needs so Navigo's Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (Young Minds Matter) are launching a new waiting list









initiative, Workshop for Integrated Neurodiversity Group Support, fondly called WINGS, to give parents the skills and knowledge to support their child at home and school.

WINGS will run for six, two-hour face-to-face sessions where up to 20 parents can learn these skills, better understand neurodivergent needs and build a support network of like-minded parents who understand how it feels.

The aim is to allow parents to start adapting to their children's unique abilities and difficulties, and to allow them to understand why some of the behaviours are being presented.

Session 2: Emotional Regulation

Session 3: Managing and Supporting Behaviour

Session 4: Support for you and the Family

Session 5: Sleep

Session 6: The Assessment Process

How can I access the sessions?

The first set of sessions started in April 2024 and will continue as a rolling programme throughout the year. The team will be inviting families currently waiting for an assessment based on when they first referred to the service.

Early Years (0-5 years) Specialist Support

Just a reminder: we are open to requests for support from any setting with 0-5 age range.

We now have an expanded team with two Area SENDCos who can offer specific strategies for EY children with emerging and identified additional needs. We can support with Information Advice & Guidance (IAG) on writing assessment requests to the Neurodevelopmental Team, EHCARs and Inclusion Funding.

News about Neurodiversity in Early Years (Train the Trainer)

Colleagues working in early years settings and infant schools have been selected to train and become an accredited trainer in Neurodiversity support for children and young people.

Successful candidates will be completing two neurodiversity courses: An Introduction into Neurodiverse Behaviours in Early Years and Strategies to Support Neurodiverse Behaviours in Early Years and complete a "train the trainer" module allowing them to deliver the courses within their settings and across settings in North East Lincolnshire.

National Autistic Society's EarlyBirds training in NEL

NELC have been busy ensuring that a wide range of practitioners/professionals from different settings and services are trained and qualified to deliver the National Autistic Society's EarlyBird programme. Through the programme, parents and carers will learn more about autism, and discover new ways to support their child, following a diagnosis and meet other parent carers with similar lived experiences.









They now have 7 trainers across Early Years team, Family Hubs and NAVIGo who have all completed the Early Birds training which will be launched for our first cohort of families in September. NELC are also working on a plan to advertise the course to families who have a child under 7 who has had a diagnosis in the last two years. Please look out for further information in September.

FREE Training for NEL's Educational Settings and Services

We would like to offer you and your setting/service an opportunity to come and learn about an intervention programme called Understanding Myself. The Understanding Myself programme has been developed by Daisy Chain as part of the Autism in Schools Project which aims to support schools to provide positive environments for children and young people (CYP) with neurodiverse needs, with or with a diagnosis and it could also be useful to support CYP with Social, Emotional & Mental Health (SEMH).

It has been piloted and adapted in co-production with neurodiverse (Autistic) young people and is underpinned by numerous psychological theories and practices. The aims of the intervention is to increase self-awareness; help others understand the needs of the young people and their unique experiences of the world; improve self-esteem and raise confidence.

The programme was commissioned by the North East & Cumbria Accelerator Programme and has been developed specifically for young people between the ages of 14 and 17 who either have a neurodevelopmental diagnosis or are experiencing traits associated with a neurodevelopmental diagnosis. However, the programme is beneficial for younger children and young people, including primary aged children/young people. The sessions have been designed to help the young people who attend them to understand and be able to communicate their needs and are based around the following six topics:

Session 1: Getting to know me	Session 4: The 5-point scale
Session 2: Sensory challenges	Session 5: Self-esteem & positivity
Session 3: Anger and anxiety	Session 6: Communication passports

We are offering four dates that you can access the training session; we will walk you through the programme (you only need to attend one of these sessions) and we will provide you with a FREE copy of the programme and all its resources after completing the training session.

Support for Parent Carers and families of CYP with Neurodiverse Needs



Hi everyone, in this section I would like to continue to share with you my personal experience and your experiences that you have told me about. Again, some of this might be useful to you and your families and some might not but that is okay. All children are unique, each child has different strengths and areas that may need additional support.

Do not forget how important it is to_talk with other parent carers who have similar lived experiences. I cannot stress how much you can gain from meeting other parent carers who have similar experiences and our unique children bring us together, sharing ideas, experiences and things that we have learnt. This issue I am going to focus on **Education / Training**, advice and guidance.

Here are a few of the local services that we have personally received help/support/guidance from:

- NAViGO Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (Young Minds Matter) offer <u>free</u> virtual training to help
 parents and carers increase their understanding of mental health issues. The workshops help build confidence in
 supporting children and young people in the family home and cover a range of topics. These are totally free of
 charge, online and able to be taken at a time that suits you. <u>Workshops for Parents and Carers</u>
 - NAViGo also provide a range of free virtual Workshops for Professionals
- **School Staff** Our son's school provided us with copies of visual resources that they used in school with Oliver. They also provided us with a wealth of visual resources that were home related too. This really helped Oliver as he liked the continuity between home and school. In fact we still use them for Oliver's daily visual timetable.
- Check out <u>NELC SEND Local Offer | Events</u> page for details on events for parent carers I found Makaton training advertised on the Local Offer and my husband and I are now Makaton Level 3 trained. The training sessions were fun and very interactive; we now have another method to use to communicate with our non-verbal son! NELC do offer Makaton courses locally so keep an eye on the Events page via the link at the beginning of this bullet point. Also, Makaton have some free, downloadable resources that you can find using this link: <u>Free resources (makaton.org)</u>
- National Autistic Society has lots of useful training, advice and guidance, videos, etc. What is autism
- I have completed the National Autistic Society's EarlyBirds, EarlyBird Plus and Teen Life programmes and would recommend them to any parent carers who are able to attend them. For more details on the availability of the EarlyBirds programme in NEL please click on this Link. All the programmes contain lots of useful information, facts, books, websites, videos and lots more. In addition to all of that you will gain countless pieces of advice, strategies, resources from the trainers and the other parent carers/ members of the group. The most inventive idea I received about toilet training a 7 year old came from another parent on the programme.
- <u>SENDIASS North East Lincolnshire</u> is a free service for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities and their parents and carers. It's impartial and gives confidential information, advice and support in relation to special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and related health and social care matters. We've used this service a couple of times now and they have been a great help, providing information and supporting us during some very challenging and emotional times!
- <u>Children's Disability Service</u> Parents Supporting Parents is a friendly, relaxed group, providing emotional support, guidance, friendships and practical solutions Thursday mornings 9:30am until 11:30am (Parents / Carers & children) At Central Family Hub Edward Street, Grimsby, DN32 9HL
- <u>Carers Support Service</u> The Carers' Support Service is the main port of call for Carers in Northern Lincolnshire. There is a range of free and confidential practical and emotional support on offer. Click on the link and take a look through their website to see what support is available for you and your family. I have personally received the following help and support from the Carers Support Service:
 - o Help with completing a Disability Living Allowance application.
 - o I have attended coffee mornings held at the Carers Centre with other parent carers.
 - o I have received regular check-in phone calls from a member of the team.
 - Once you've signed up to the service you receive a regular newsletter containing lots of useful and local information.
 - o I also had a free massage... which was fabulous!
